The Problem of Hunger

How can so many people be going hungry in a nation that throws so much food away?

The Problem of Hunger



- 37 million Americans are "food insecure"
- Definition insufficient access to enough food to live a healthy, active lifestyle
- That includes 11 million children
- 35 million tons of food thrown away annually

Hunger in the QCA

- 1,042,852 people in the 23 counties we serve
- 105,830 are food insecure (pre-COVID)
- 10.1%
- 1 in 10 people
- Missing 17,910,200 meals per year



Hunger Hurts the Most Vulnerable


- 230,240 children in our 23 counties
- 34,500 are food insecure (pre-COVID)
- 15%
- 1 in 7 children



Impact of COVID on Food Insecurity

- 105,830 159,848 are food insecure
- 10.1% 15.3%
- 1 in 10 1 in 7 people
- 34,500 55,575 children are food insecure
- 15% 24.1%
- 1 in 7 1 in 4 children
- Food insecurity is up over 50% since COVID



 Rescuing food that would otherwise be discarded






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MEALS DISTRIBUTED BY YEAR 2002 - 2020






Meals Distributed vs Meal Gap


